CHAMPAGNE

1. **Baron du Beaupre, Brut** £49.95
A good, character-full champagne with fine mousse, fully fruity flavour and a toasty finish.
2. **Laurent-Perrier, Brut 'La Cuevee'** £79.95
This is beautifully balanced with fine streams of flowing bubbles the hallmark of the finest Champagne - leading to delicate citrus and subtle floral notes on the nose. Courtesy of one of the last great family-run houses in Champagne.
3. **Laurent-Perrier, Brut 'Cuvee Rose'** £95.95
Laurent-Perrier Cuvee Rose Brut is famous for its highly expressive bouquet, from the very careful preservation of the grape's natural fresh red fruit aromas, and salmon pink colour which stems from the maceration techniques used. One of the rare Rose champagnes using the maceration technique giving extraordinary depth and freshness that has made it the benchmark for Rose champagne.
4. **Dom Perignon 2012** £285.00
Dom Perignon is the most famous Champagne in the world., and for good reason. The bouquet sparkles with delicate fresh violets, white peaches, the most delicate of fine bubbles and an outstanding complexity. Simply stunning.



SPARKLING WINES

5. **Prosecco, Cantina Trevigiana, Extra Dry** £28.95
Pale, straw yellow. Flowery bouquet reminiscent of acacia flowers, with notes of apple and peach. Fresh, balanced and pleasantly acidic on the palate, with moderate alcohol content.
- 5a. **Prosecco, Extra dry, Ponte** 200ml Bottle £8.50
6. **Prosecco, Cantina Trevigiana, Rose Brut** £28.95
An elegant, delicate pink. A distinctive and intensely pleasing aroma with hints of lychee and acacia. Notes of white peach and wild rose. Excellent as an aperitif and with shellfish and crudites.

ROSE WINES

8. **Pinot Grigio Rose, Ponte - Italy** £26.95
It has a light pink nuance with copper reflections. Fruity, delicate, complex on the nose. Light with intense aromas of rose and red apple. It is an ideal aperitif but also matches well with slightly spicy foods.

9. **Rose d'Anjou, les Roseraies - France** £29.95
Rose d'Anjou is a classic, off-dry French rosé from the Loire Valley. It displays a bright watermelon-pink colour, a fresh red-fruit profile, and a soft, medium-sweet palate balanced by a crisp, refreshing acidity
10. **The Beach, Caves d'Esclans, Cotes de Provence - France** £31.95
Clear & very expressive with great aromatic freshness on the nose, including aromas of red berries with hints of lime and melon. The Beach rosé is subtle and smooth... showing a balanced acidity and minerality with delicious citrus and red fruit flavours. This rosé wine is fresh and round with a light and long peach, citrus flare.



WHITE WINES

11. **Sauvignon Blanc, 'Casa Santiago', Vina Requingua - Chile** £26.95
A light bodied wine offering plentiful fresh fruit, crisp acidity and a pleasing finish.

12. **Pinot Grigio, Ponte - Italy** £26.95
Hugely popular, this delicious crisp, dry white wine has subtle apple and fruit flavours. Easy drinking and very enjoyable with or without food.

13. **Chardonnay, Ladera Verde - Chile** £26.95
Bright lemon with gold hues in colour. In the nose are marked aromas of white pulp fruits and floral notes, with subtle hints of caramel. On the palate this is a fresh wine, with a pleasant acidity and good persistence.

14. **Chenin Blanc, Wide River - South Africa** £27.95
Light, with lovely ripe, attractive rounded fruit. Fresh floral nose and an exciting acid balance. A beautifully finished, clean off-day Chenin Blanc.
15. **Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, Waipara Hills - New Zealand** £29.95
Made from 100% Sauvignon Blanc sourced from vineyards in both the Wairau and Awatere valleys of the Marlborough region. Settled juice is fermented with a range of yeasts at cool temperatures for about three weeks, a period of resting off the lees is followed by bottling. A generous and lifted style, showing powerful aromas of melon, nettle and snow pea, the palate bursts with fresh citrus, grapefruit and melon notes, the fruit carrying through to the aromatic finish.
16. **Gavi, Tienemeni, Ca Bianca - Italy** £32.50
In the southern part of the province of Alessandria near the Ligurian Apennines, we find excellent wine country for the production of the great Piedmont white, Gavi. Due to the deep valleys, proximity to the sea and the micro-climate of this area, wines display unique peculiarities, which combine the characteristic structure of wines from the Po Valley with the richness of flavour generated by the salty sea breezes.
17. **Muscadet de Sevre et Maine, Sur Lie, Chateau de la Cassemichere - France** £34.95
Muscadet is a light-bodied, dry white wine made from Melon de Bourgogne grapes that impart lemon, lime, green apple and pear flavors. This highly-acidic wine - also known for mineral and salty characteristics - is meant to be consumed young, and pairs well with seafood
18. **Macon Lugny, 'Les Genievres' Louis Latour - France** £35.95
Macon-Lugny 'Les Genievres' carries aromas of honey and acacia, with exceptional roundness in the mouth. Ample and complete, this wine offers flavours of white fruits and honey. The village of Lugny is located high up in the South of the Macon region. It has a great reputation for its white wines which has made Macon famous. It is well known that the village of Lugny, with its limestone soils and warm climate, produces the most coveted white wines of the region.
19. **Chablis, Domaine Michaut - France** £39.95
The wine is vigorous, fresh with floral notes; a wine that goes well with Burgundy snails, Chablis sausage and seafood. This wine can age from 5 to 7 years. Awarded the IWSC French Wine Producer of the Year 2013.
20. **Pouilly-Fume, Le Chant des Vignes, Joseph Mellot - France** £39.95
A complex nose of grapefruit and gunflint, with a fresh tropical fruit palate. This wine has exceptional length. The grapes are grown on predominantly siliceous soils. All vineyard processes are carried out in an environmental manner, adapted to each terroir.



RED WINES

21. **Shiraz, 'Silver Series'**
Tempus Two - Australia £26.95
Rich and ripe raspberries balanced with subtle notes of white pepper. Red berries, with hints of white pepper and spice. Well integrated soft tannins providing great length and finish.

22. **Merlot, Ladera Verde - Chile** £26.95
This is a lovely plummy Merlot with a ripeness and generosity that is so typical of Chilean reds. Soft and very drinkable it is the perfect accompaniment to all red meat dishes.

23. **Cabernet Sauvignon, 'The Churchyard', Franschoek Cellar - South Africa** £26.95
A wine that symbolises longevity, like the legacy of the original Huguenot families which has endured long after they were buried in the town's original churchyard. Blackcurrants and violets captivate on entry, followed by concentrated dark berry flavours and spicy tobacco oak.

24. **Pinot Noir, Le Fou - France** £29.95
Fuller than Pinot Noir from Burgundy, it has a warm, rich nose with aromas of stewed cherries. The palate is nicely balanced with an exciting, savoury bitterness provided by ripe, tasty tannins. Picked at optimum ripeness, balancing phenolics and acidity then cool vinified to enhance the fresh fruit flavours. No oak was used to keep this wine as pure and sensual as possible.
25. **Vieilles Vignes, Les Coteaux du Rhone - France** £29.95
Sourced around the medieval village of Serignan du Comtat, the grapes are carefully selected and are nourished with the sun and the wind, typical for the region, to produce traditional Rhône wine with character.
26. **Malbec, Classico, Kaiken - Argentina** £32.95
On the nose there are aromas of red fruits such as plums and blackberries, complemented by notes of chocolate and tobacco. On the palate this wine displays extraordinary balance, freshness and soft tannins.
27. **Pinotage, Sommelier Selection, Boschendal Estate - South Africa** £31.95
Rich, ripe and vibrant red and black currants, spice and plums. A classic example of South Africa's very own grape varietal.
28. **Chateau Lucas, St Emilion, Bordeaux - France** £34.95
This excellent bottle of red was produced in the Lussac St Emilion region of Bordeaux, which is noted as a prime location for growing Merlot and Cabernet Franc. This particular vintage is influenced by the terroir of the region with its mix of clay and limestone which results in subtle chalky mineral notes.
29. **Rioja Gran Reserva, Marques de Caceres - Spain** £44.95
Dark colour with a hint of brick-red on the edge. Superb complexity on the nose with balsamic notes and refined oak. Full in the mouth with a depth of mature plums, sweet spice and roasted coffee beans. Still fresh and discreetly lively, promising excellent potential for ageing. Delicious and full with superb length.
30. **Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Muga - Spain** £45.95
On the nose you discover an intense, complex wine. Aromas of wild fruits of the forest (blackberries and blueberries) come to the fore, with hints of spices. On the palate it is long, elegant and nicely balanced. Its sharp acidity is perfectly integrated and it has soft tannins. The finish is very long and full of fruit.
